Summary of Action:

 - Net income for the Catalina Council is at a surplus YTD of \$18,182.

Financial Snapshot & Trends

- Overall, the council appears to be following normal BSA business cycle trends.
- Gala gross was \$37,936 with a fully loaded net of \$22,418.
- Received Furrow Fund Foundation of just under \$40,000.
- Popcorn net is 53% of budget but a 2.5x multiple of prior year.
- FOS is off budget by \$55,500.

Financial Ratios

- The council has seen an increase in liquidity and decrease in debt ratios over the past year.
- Great progress in 2021 should end with a surplus before adjustments.

- SE Minute: SE Hotchkiss reminded the committee of the good news in the Council, even as we continue to have to deal with the pandemic and the National bankruptcy.

Acceptance of Anderson Land Gift to Catalina Council

Pima County Property, Book 303, Map 37, Parcel 0210 was quitclaimed to the Council on 12/31/19. It is an undeveloped parcel in an undeveloped housing tract.

The Anderson's state the following in an 11/16/20 email:

"The gift is unrestricted; use the proceeds wherever you want when it is sold. However, this gift is to be used exclusively for the benefit of the Catalina Council Boy Scouts of Southern Arizona and for no other entity.

We are expecting that you will hold the property at least for 2 years has been done in the case of several other properties donated to the council."

After our due diligence of both a parcel visit, internet records check and the review of an appraisal of the property we do the following:

Approved to accept this land donation with these restrictions on 12/14/21, and further authorize the Scout Executive to sell this land at his earliest convenience subject to any required approvals from the National Council and that the offer be within the appraisal range.

Resolution - Approval of the Audit Committee -

- 4. Review the independent auditor's fee arrangements.
- Have a post-audit meeting to review the draft copy of the financial statements and independent auditor's report and recommendations on internal control, operating procedures, and suggestions for improvements as outlined in the management letter.
- Review compliance of the audit with the BSA standards on accounting and adequacy of management's policies and procedures on accounting and make recommendations.
- Review the adequacy of disclosure of information with management.
- 8. Present the audited financial statements and audit findings to the board following review with the independent auditor.
- Periodically review the council's system of internal control.
- 10. Review the independent auditor's performance using the BSA's audit checklist.

Be it Resolved, the Catalina Council appoints the following for 2022: Devin Allard to serve as Chair, Joe Daniszewski, and Bryan Eto to serve as members; Don Riegger, Council Treasurer, and Jeff Hotchkiss, Scout Executive, as ex-officio members.
